



### **About NCC**

National Cadet Corps is a Tri-Services Organisation comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force, engaged in grooming the youth – 'The Leaders of Tomorrow' – into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The genesis of the NCC can be traced back to the First World War when the Britishers created the University Corps as the second line of defense and to have a large pool of trained youth available for employment into the Armed Forces. After independence the present day NCC under the Ministry of Defence came into existence on 16 Apr 1948 through NCC act XXXI, 1948. NCC was formally inaugurated on 15 Jul 1948 as soon as the schools and colleges reopened after summer vacation. The Girls Division of the NCC was started in Jul 1949. In 1950 Air Wing was added on 01 Apr with one Air squadron each at Bombay and Kolkata. The Naval Wing of the NCC was raised in Jul 1952, thus completing the true representation of all services in the Corps. Presently, NCC has approximately 13 Lakhs Cadets under its fold.

### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- **Age:**

*Senior Division (College Level):* Up to 26 years

- **Educational Requirement:**

Must be enrolled in a college that has an NCC unit (like MVGR for Senior Division).

- **Physical Fitness:**

Should be medically fit and able to participate in physical activities and drills

- **Willingness & Discipline:**

Must show interest in NCC training, discipline, camps, and service activities

- **Citizenship:**

Must be a citizen of India

### **Enrollment Process:**

- **Notification & Registration:**

Every academic year, the NCC unit releases a notification. Interested students register by filling out the NCC application form provided by the college/NCC office.

- **Initial Screening:**

Shortlisted applicants are called for a screening that includes physical fitness checks, discipline assessment, and personal interaction.

- **Document Verification:**

Students must submit required documents such as ID proof, academic details, bank Account Details and medical fitness certificates.

- **Final Selection & Enrollment:**

Selected candidates are officially enrolled into the NCC Senior Division. They receive their NCC Enrollment ID and begin attending regular drills and training sessions.

### **Training Schedule:**

NCC activities are conducted 3 days per week (Monday, Wednesday and Saturday) on normal days and are conducted everyday if there is any significant event (such as Independence day, Republic day or any other)

**Timings:** 4:10P.M to 6P.M

#### **List of NCC Activities:**

- **Drill Practice:** Marching, saluting, and parade preparation.
- **Physical Training (PT):** Running, warm-ups, endurance exercises.
- **Weapon Training:** Basic handling, safety instructions, and firing practice (as allotted).
- **Theory Classes:** Sessions on leadership, map reading, military history, first aid, communication, and national integration.
- **Social Service Activities:** Cleanliness drives, blood donation camps, awareness rallies, and community service programs.
- **Service Camps & Events:** Participation in national days (Independence Day, Republic Day) with parade duties.
- **Adventure & Outdoor Activities:** Trekking, cycling, hiking, and field craft basics.
- **Cultural Activities:** Training for cultural events, competitions, and camp-level performances.

### **Activities & Achievements**

#### **Major Events Organized or Attended:**

**1. Independence Day & Republic Day Parades:** NCC cadets participate in ceremonial parades, flag hoisting, and cultural programs, showcasing discipline and patriotism. They also assist in organizing campus-level celebrations.

**2. Annual Training Camp (ATC):** A 10–12 day camp where cadets undergo intensive training in drill, weapon handling, firing, map reading, first aid, and group activities. It builds discipline, teamwork, and leadership.

**3. Combined Annual Training Camp (CATC):** A consolidated camp bringing together cadets from multiple colleges/schools for advanced training, competitions, and selection trials for higher-level camps.

**4. National Integration Camp (NIC):** A camp aimed at promoting cultural exchange. Cadets from various states participate in cultural performances, community outreach, and awareness programs, fostering unity and diversity.

**5. Republic Day Camp (RDC):** A prestigious camp held in Delhi where selected cadets represent their states. They participate in the Republic Day parade, cultural events, PM's rally, and national-level competitions.

**6. Thal Sainik Camp (TSC):** Focused on Army-oriented activities like map reading, firing, field craft, obstacle training, and survival skills. Cadets compete for national-level positions.

**7. Trekking & Adventure Camps:** These camps involve trekking, rock climbing, cycling, and adventure activities that build physical endurance, courage, and outdoor survival skills.

**8. Social Service & Community Activities:** Events like blood donation drives, Swachh Bharat campaigns, tree plantation, road safety awareness, and disaster management training that encourage social responsibility.

**9. Armed Forces Attachment Camps:** Cadets spend 10–14 days with Army, Navy, or Air Force units, observing military life, equipment, drills, and real-time operations. It inspires cadets aiming for defense careers.

**10. Yoga Day & Health Awareness Events:** Cadets participate in International Yoga Day, fitness events, and health awareness programs promoting well-being and discipline.
